



FRANK HUANG, the Summer Workshop's Artist-in-Residence, is the first-prize winner of the 2003 Walter W. Naumberg Foundation's Violin Competition and 2000 Hannover International Violin Competition. Huang has established a major career as a violin virtuoso. At age eleven, he performed with the Houston Symphony in a nationally broadcast concert and since has performed throughout the world. In 2009, Mr. Huang was Associate Professor of Violin and Chamber Music at Eastman School of Music and the 1st violinist of the Grammy award-winning Ying Quartet. Currently, he is concertmaster of the Houston Symphony and on the faculty of University of Houston Moores School of Music. During the summer, he serves as faculty at several international music festivals as well as the Texas Music Festival. He also serves as violinist of the Huang-Altstead-Vonsttel Trio and concertmaster and leader of Sejon Soloists, based in New York.
